1.1 COVID-19 measures

1.2 Responsibilities

Should the event have to be cancelled at a later stage the LOC will try its' best to handle the force majeure situation with the reimbursement of costs for accommodation and meal bookings. However, the financial responsibility for all bookings (travel, accommodation, meals) remains with the NF.

In order to maintain the safety of everyone participating in the event it is the responsibility of the NF that all of their delegation members commit to fully respect the Covid-19 measures. We are convinced the Covid-19 risks can be brought to a minimum by doing this. Nonetheless, the responsibility for eventual quarantine and/or positive Covid19 cases concerning their delegation remains with the NF. This includes the covering of all costs.

2.2 Competitions Format

The FIG requirements for Juniors and for Seniors will be applied for all phases of competitions.

Event ID, Senior: 16903

Event ID, Junior: 17007

According to FIG TR 2022, the 2022 European Championships is a qualifying event for the World Championships. For details, see the FIG TR **Art. 5.1.1 Qualifications Pathway to the World Championships**.

QUALIFYING COMPETITION

Seniors - Qualifying Competition incl. All-Around Final, plus qualification for Apparatus Finals and Team Final

Juniors - Qualifying Competition incl. All-Around Final & Team Final, plus qualification for Apparatus Finals

A Senior and Junior team consists of 3 - 5 gymnasts, of which up to 4 compete on each apparatus. The 3 best scores on each apparatus are added together to make the total score for the Team on that apparatus. The NF nominates the team on each apparatus.

If a Federation does not have a sufficient number of gymnasts for a full team, it is possible to participate with Individual gymnasts.

A separate All-Around Final result list will be produced including the 24 gymnasts with the highest ranking obtained. A maximum of 2 gymnasts per Federation will be taken into consideration.

The results from the Senior Qualifying competition will determine the All-Around Senior European Artistic Gymnastics Champion 2022.

The results from the Junior Qualifying competition will determine the Junior European Artistic Gymnastics Team Champions 2022 as well as the All-Around Junior European Artistic Gymnastic Champion 2022.

There will be no separate Junior All-Around final at the 2022 European Championships.

SENIORS & JUNIORS - Apparatus Finals

The 8 highest ranked gymnasts on each apparatus from the Qualifying Competition will qualify for the respective Apparatus Final. A maximum of two gymnasts per federation will be allowed in the finals.

SENIORS - Team final

The 8 best Teams from the Qualifying Competition will participate in the Team Final. The teams consist of 3 to 5 gymnasts, of which up to 3 compete on each apparatus. The 3 best scores on each apparatus are added and make the total result. The NF nominates the team for each apparatus.

RESERVE GYMNASTS:

For the Apparatus Finals, the following number of reserve gymnasts will be designated, by taking into account the respective Apparatus ranking results in the Qualification Competition:

- Three (3) gymnasts per apparatus

If called upon, a reserve works in accordance with the order of the gymnasts replaced. Reserves must be prepared to compete and must be present in the warm-up hall in case they are called upon.

2.2.1 Qualifying competition (QC) - Juniors and Seniors:

In case of a tie at any position at the end of the QC, the tie breaking rules set out in FIG/TR apply.

Starting orders for competitions will be according to the drawing of lots carried out on **July 7th**, 2022, by the head office of European Gymnastics. After the draw the start lists will be published by the office of European Gymnastics.

If a national federation has made a nominative inscription with a team and will present only individuals by the time of the competition or if the number of individuals is less than the number of the gymnasts from the nominative inscription by the time of the competition, the European Gymnastics MTC is entitled to make adjustments of the starting order for the competition, according to the actual number of gymnasts present at the competition.

Team: the competing order for gymnasts in a team is decided by the national federation.

Mixed group: NF with more than one gymnast must submit the order for their gymnasts on each apparatus.

The competing order of the teams/mixed groups will not change during the competition. The gymnasts of the first team/mixed group will warm-up and compete; then the gymnasts of the second team/group will warm-up and compete. The team/mixed group will compete in the same order in the subsequent apparatus.

If one gymnast is not competing on all apparatus, he has the right to leave the competition area and warm-up in the warm-up hall. The gymnast may return at their own discretion.

2.2.2 Team Final (TF) - Seniors







According to the FIG/TR, in case of a tie in points at any place in TF the tie breaking rules apply.

The competing order of the teams will do alternate the team **as below (updated)**

The numbers correspond with the ranking of the teams after the qualifying competition

If one gymnast does not compete on all apparatus, he has the right to leave the competition area and warm-up in the warm-up hall. The gymnast may return at their own discretion.

The medal ceremony takes place on the podium immediately after the competition (3 teams on the podium).

2.2.3 Apparatus Finals (AF) - Juniors and Seniors

If a qualified gymnast is prevented from taking part in AF competition, he can be replaced by the next gymnast from his federation, if his result in QUALIFICATION is better than that of the first reserve.

The reserve will be placed on the starting position of the gymnast he replaces.

If more than 8 gymnasts are qualified in one apparatus final, a draw will take place, to determine the starting order.

If a gymnast competes in two (or more) successive apparatus finals and medals in the preceding final (thus reducing the gymnasts' opportunity to return to the warm-up hall prior to the next final), the MTC will adjust the Start Order if needed.

The start order of the final following the medal presentation will be adjusted accordingly and places 6, 7 & 8 will be allocated to these gymnasts (if necessary).

Apparatus Finals - Juniors

The junior apparatus finals will take place following the European Gymnastics system, namely two apparatus at the same time, divided into 3 blocks (floor-pommel horse, rings-vault and parallel bars-high bar);

The touch warm-up will take place on the podium.

The following principles will apply for the drawing of lots:

- I. If there are gymnasts qualified at two apparatus from the same block, they will compete:
 - At the first apparatus in the first group (starting order by draw) and
 - At the second apparatus in the second group (the same starting order as the first apparatus in order to allow him enough time to rest);
 - For instance, one gymnast that will compete 3rd in the first group at floor will compete 3rd in the second group at pommel horse.
- II. If there are in one block more than 4 gymnasts qualified for 2 apparatus we will have a draw:
 - The first 4 gymnasts from the first group at the first apparatus (valid as well as starting order);



- The starting order of the remaining gymnasts at the second apparatus in the first group, together with the other finalists;
- For instance, 6 gymnasts are qualified for the finals at floor and at pommel horse: 1st draw – finding the first 4 gymnasts from the first group at floor; the same starting order for the second group at pommel horse. 2nd draw – the starting order of the remaining 2 gymnasts at pommel horse in the first group together with the other 2 finalists. The same starting order at floor for the second group. 3rd draw – the starting order of the other finalists at floor for the second group.

III. If one finalist has to be replaced for different reasons after the draw by one finalist who is already finalist in the same block at another apparatus and in the same block number:

- This finalist will keep his position drawn already;
- This finalist will take the 3rd position in another group of the apparatus of the replaced gymnast;
- We will have in this case one group of 3 gymnasts and one group of 5 gymnasts;
- For instance, finalist A at floor in the first group must be replaced by the gymnast B, who is already in the pommel horse final in the first group:
 - The place of the gymnast A in the first group at floor will remain free (only 3 finalists);
 - ❖ The gymnast B will keep his place in the first group at pommel horse;
 - ❖ The gymnast B is the third in the second group at floor (5 finalists)

– The timing for the Juniors' apparatus finals is the following:

2.3 Tie breaking rules

In case of a tie at any position at the end of each competition, the tie breaking rules set out in FIG/TR will apply.

2.4 Changes of the starting order

Withdrawals/replacements of gymnasts for medical reasons will be accepted, in accordance with the FIG/TR. Forms have to be submitted to Mr. Nikolaos PROVIAS, the European Gymnastics MAG Technical Delegate.

2.5 Touch warm-up during competition

Warm-up times according to the FIG rules.

- QC juniors on the podium.
- QC and TF seniors on the podium.
- AF juniors and seniors on the podium.

2.6 Access to the competition area

The competition area is accessible to competing gymnasts and their accredited coaches, members of various juries, local group leaders, the auxiliary personnel of the Jury, the President of the European Gymnastics Medical Commission, the official doctor, the team doctors, medical staff and to persons concerned with the apparatus. A team medical person is permitted to accompany the gymnasts and coaches during all competitions.

Interpreters may not enter the competition area without the permission of Mr. Tom Thingvold, the President of the European Gymnastics/MTC. The competition area is strictly forbidden to all other persons.

Concerning the presence of the coaches and medical team on the podium the following provisions will apply:

- Each team in QC and TF may be assisted in the competition area by not more than 2 coaches. For individual gymnasts only 1 coach per gymnast is allowed (maximum 2 coaches).
- For AF competition only 1 coach per gymnast is allowed;
- For all competitions, 1 team medical person per national federation is allowed.

2.7 Use of electronic devices (European Gymnastics/TR)

During the duration of official European Gymnastics competitions (which is defined as starting the moment the first gymnast enters the field of play and ending the moment the last score is made public):

- Judges on the field of play are absolutely prohibited from using cellular phones and any other kind of electronic communication devices.
- Other delegation members (gymnasts, coaches, medical staff) are prohibited from using cellular phones and any other kind of electronic communication devices. However, gymnasts are allowed to listen to music (with earphones and on a sound level which is not observable for surrounding persons). It is also allowed to other delegation members to take photos (but no videos), without flash and not interrupting the running of the competition.

If these rules are violated, the persons concerned will receive a verbal warning.

If this behaviour is repeated after the written warning is issued, those persons concerned will be excluded for the rest of the competition.

The Superior Jury is responsible to decide these disciplinary measures.

Appeals against these decisions have to be submitted to the Jury of Appeal whose decision is final.

2.8 Medal ceremonies

The medal ceremonies will take place on the podium, immediately after the competition, or during the competition for AF, according to the schedule and will be organised as follows:

- Qualifying Competition Juniors: All-Around & Team: Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium
- Qualifying Competition Seniors: All-Around: Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium
- Team Final Seniors: Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium
- Apparatus Finals Juniors: Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium
- Apparatus Finals Seniors: Gold, Silver and Bronze medallists on podium

According to the FIG/TR, the gymnasts have to wear the national **tracksuit** during the medal ceremonies. The participation in the medal ceremonies is compulsory. Gymnasts that are absent for unjustified reasons will be disqualified.

Please note: to ensure the presence of all medal winners for the medal ceremonies for the Senior All-Around decision, we kindly ask the **Top 3 athletes** to stay in the **delegation seating and on-hold for the LOC from subdivision 2 on**.

2.9 Apparatus

The apparatus supplier of this European Championships is Spieth.

2.10 Scoring and distribution of results

After each competition, the results will be provided on Internet on the following website: <https://www.munich2022.com/en>.

In addition, it will be sent to the Heads of Delegation by e-mail. At the end of the competition all delegations will be provided with a complete set of results including the judges' individual scores for all competitions.

2.11 Competitions numbers (Bib)

Two (2) sets of competition numbers will be provided to the Head of Delegation by the LOC during Orientation meeting. The numbers must be firmly attached to the competition attire throughout the whole competition.

2.12 New elements

New elements should be submitted by e-mail to Mr. Tom Thingvold, tom.thingvold@hent.no, the President of the Superior Jury, as early as possible but at the very latest 24h before the podium training. A technical drawing and a video have to be attached to the e-mail.

2.13 Anti-doping control

Any doping is prohibited. An anti-doping control can be requested at any time. Anti-doping controls will be made as per Anti-Doping Control Regulations of FIG and WADA.

3.1 Jury of Appeal

The Jury of Appeal is composed of two members of the European Gymnastics Executive Committee (one of them acting as President) and a member of the LOC who was not involved in the decision of the Superior Jury and the judging process on the concerned apparatus.

3.3 Apparatus Jury

The MTC reserves the right to adapt, if necessary, the composition of the judge's panels according to the situation.


All registered judges must hold a valid FIG judges brevet. To be allowed to judge the judges must have taken part in the judges' instructions, in the drawing of lots and in the briefings preceding the competitions. In case there is an insufficient number of judges from the present participating national federations, the European Gymnastics/MTC decides the process for designating the necessary number of judges.

Each federation is permitted to have up to 4 technical officials in attendance at the Championships but to have a maximum of 3 on the field of play at any time. Each Federation can have a maximum of 2 judges in the D Jury (Supervisor/D1/D2) and a maximum of 2 judges in the E Jury.

3.3.1 D-jury

Supervisors and D1 Judges were appointed, and D2 Judges drawn by federation, after the nominative entry deadline by the European Gymnastics/MTC from amongst those with FIG Brevet category I and II.

D1- and D2 judges remain the same throughout the entire competition in Juniors and in Seniors as follows:

3.3.2 E-Jury

E-judges (Execution Judges) will be decided by drawing of lots on site.

The E-jury consists of 7 E-judges.

If needed, European Gymnastics MTC will adapt the size of the judges' panel to adapt to the actual situation.

For apparatus finals competition Juniors and Seniors, only judges from federations without qualified gymnasts (including the first reserve) will be allowed to judge in the E-Jury at the concerned apparatus.

All entered judges must be available until the drawing of lots for the last competition of the respective European Championships. Exceptions have to be managed by Mr. Tom THINGVOLD, the President of the European Gymnastics/MTC.

If needed, judges registered for the Senior competitions will be used also for Junior competitions and vice versa.

Cat 4 judges, if present, are only allowed to judge line and time.

➔ As a reminder and according to the European Gymnastics/TR the function of a judge cannot be combined with any other function.

3.4 Judges' instruction and draw of lots

According to the European Gymnastics/TR, the presence of the judges to the judges' instruction is mandatory. The judges' instruction will be held in English. The judges' oath will be carried out at the end of the judges' instruction, by one of the host federation's judges.

3.5 Inquiries of the score

European Gymnastics applies the relevant TR/FIG article.

Referring to European Championships organised for Juniors and Seniors, the complaints are distinct for each age group (i.e. the ECh MAG Seniors is distinct from the ECh MAG Juniors).

If the inquiry is refused, the amount will be invoiced by European Gymnastics (in Euro, not in USD), later on and must be paid within one month.

4.2 Orientation meeting

The orientation meeting will be held on **Monday, August 15th**, 2022 at **20:00** in the Judges Meeting Room in **the Olympiahalle**. The presence of the participating National Federations at the orientation meeting is mandatory. A maximum of 3 members per delegation, including the Head of Delegation is permitted. Unjustified failure to attend will result in a sanction against the federation of Euro €1,000.

4.3 Training information

Two sessions of training will be provided to the participating federations. The minimum time between the two daily training sessions for a group must be 4 hours.

A detailed programme of the training will be provided to the participating national federations. The delegations are obliged to respect the training schedules.

D-jury (D1 and D2 judges) may attend all sessions of training.

E-judges may attend training sessions only during the training session of their own team.

4.4 Official podium training

A detailed program of the official podium training will be provided to the participating national federations. Presence of E judges at the official podium training is not mandatory.

4.5 Lightning

For the Senior Apparatus Finals there will be a special lightning for the respective apparatus. Therefore, an additional podium training will be offered after the Seniors Team Final on Saturday.

4.6 Accreditation

Accreditations will be handed out to Artistic Gymnastics National Federations at the Delegation Information Desk in the Olympiahalle.

The accreditation for judges will be handed out upon arrival in the official judges' hotel.

Upon accreditation, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative will have to provide to the LOC the following:

- The passport of the gymnasts and judges
- The licences of the gymnasts, judges, coaches and medical staff
- The medical insurance covering Covid19 for all delegation members (if not sent by email);
- Proof of the fulfilment of all financial obligations to the LOC (accommodation, meals);
- Departure confirmation
- Request for raising of apparatus, or removal of the supplementary mat.

4.8 Meals

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be offered at the hotels. The mealtimes at the hotel are aligned with the athletes' competition schedule.

During the booking process the teams and judges can book their preferred meal option such as breakfast, half board and full board for their stay.

Note – Lunch will be provided at the venue for **ALL Judges** (D&E / Junior & Senior) on the days of Podium Training. On day of Qualification Competition (D&E Junior & / Senior) and on the day of Apparatus Finals (Junior & Senior) all "active Judges" (D&E) will receive lunch at the venue.

Farewell Banquet

The Farewell Banquet for MAG delegations will take place on **Sunday, the 21st August 2022** after the last competitions.

Accredited Delegation members (with the exception of E- and R- media), who will stay at one of the official hotels and will book their accommodation through the LOC will receive a free ticket for the Farewell Banquet. All other persons wishing to attend the Banquet will be entitled to do so, provided that a request is sent to the LOC by emailing gymnastics@munich2022.com by **4th July 2022**, requesting the number of tickets required. The amount per ticket per person will be 50€.

4.9 Transportation

International Transportation

The invited participating Federations must pay for the travel costs of their delegation members. The European Gymnastics and the LOC strongly recommend that each Federation takes cancellation insurance for their international transportation.

The official arrival airport is Munich Airport (MUC).

All accredited teams and judges who have booked an official hotel through the Munich 2022 LOC will be provided with transfers from and to Munich Airport (MUC) or Munich Main Station. The deadline for travel details via the Munich 2022 EMS is **10th July 2022**.

Local Transportation

All accredited teams and judges who have booked an official hotel through the Munich 2022 LOC **and** uploaded their arrival and departure information onto the Munich 2022 EMS by **10th July 2022** will be provided with shuttles between the official hotels and Olympiahalle.

There will be no transport from and to the training venue due to sustainability reasons and the proximity between the training and competition venue, with a maximum walking time of 10 minutes (Please note: there will be back-up vehicles in case of special situations, e.g., rain).

The team shuttle buses will run according to the training and competition sessions.

Should any member of your Federation have accessibility requirements, please advise of this at the time of booking in the Munich 2022 EMS, under special requests and the LOC will be in contact to discuss arrangements.

NFs who do not stay at one of the official hotels and do not upload arrival and departure information onto the Munich 2022 EMS will not be entitled to arrival and departure transfers.

4.10 Delegation boxes

Delegation Mail Boxes will be set up at the Delegation Information Desk (DID) located in the Olympiahalle. All information regarding competition, warm-up, training, as well as European Gymnastics and LOC correspondences will be distributed via the delegation mailboxes and if possible (available as electronic file) sent by e-mail to the Heads of Delegations.

A special "Mail Box" authority card will be issued to each Head of Delegation. This card must be shown by the Head of Delegations or their designated representative when collecting all information and results from their Delegation Mail Box. The delegation member designated to collect the information from the Delegation Mail Box will be required to sign for information collected. 4.11 Medical Service

Medical Service will be provided at the official competition, warm-up and training venues. Trained medical staff will be in place during the opening hours at all official venues. If a medical emergency occurs, please search for the next medical centre or approach the nearest medical team.

Physiotherapy

Rooms for physiotherapy will be provided between August 16 and August 21. The LOC will also offer physiotherapists who can be booked free of charge (subject to availability). A list will be displayed in front of the Medical Centre for booking rooms and LOC physiotherapists.

Study EC2022

The Study is about Injuries and Illnesses while and just before a multisport event. In context of the European Championships the study team will collect anonymous data about injuries and illnesses during training, warm-up and competition.

Therefore, a study team will be present at the medical centre of all official venues and will document the injuries and illnesses. The aim of the study is a better care for athletes during multisport events. It is important to ensure better planning for athletes and organizers with a scientific foundation.

4.12 Photo Session

Each athlete's photo in national tracksuit shall be taken after the podium training in the respective room close to the Competition Hall. These photos will be used by the Scoring company for the display on the screen during the events. For this purpose, the athletes are requested to follow the dedicated volunteers to have their pictures taken.

4.13 Research Project

During the competitions the "Institut für Angewandte Trainingswissenschaften" (IAT, Germany) and "SmartRings" (SR, Netherlands) will collect additional data for research purposes on the following apparatuses: Vault and Rings.

4.14 Ticketing Information

Athletes' Tickets

In the spirit of the multi-sport event, accredited athletes will have the opportunity to attend events of all nine sports free of charge. Please note that the number of available seats depends on the capacity and occupancy of the venues.

Reservations are generally not possible, and access will be granted onsite and is subject to availability. In general, no tickets will be issued. On site, the athlete can enter the venue through a specially assigned entrance (usually located at the main entrance). Admission will be granted upon presentation of a valid EC2022 accreditation.

There is no fixed entitlement to a seat. As soon as the ticket holder claims her or his seat, the athlete must release the seat and find an alternative available seat. In most venues there will be a designated area for athletes.

The current sales status can be viewed in the European Championships 2022 webshop. By clicking on the corresponding session, the sales status can be seen.

In general, a distinction is made between the following levels of utilization:

- Available (High probability of access to the respective event)
- Limited Availability (The probability of access to the event is limited and cannot be guaranteed on site)
- Not available (access to the respective event is not possible)

The sales booth is flexible and can change at short notice, therefore access is not guaranteed.

To allow other athletes to access the venue, it is important to use the exclusive entrance again when exiting the venue. This will ensure that the ticketing volunteer frees up a space in the system and another athlete has the opportunity to visit the event.

Spectators' Tickets

As a multi-sport event, European Championships Munich 2022 hosts nine different sports. In addition to the Artistic Gymnastics competitions, there is numerous other sports spectators can enjoy and buy tickets for.
